
### Youth:

DFMAD Standing up for God can be tough and, let's face it, downright scary! Sometimes it's not the "in" or "cool" thing to say you're a Christian and then actually ACT like a Disciple of Christ. The film "God's Not Dead!" deals with this exact topic. As our teens may recall, the main character, Josh, was forced to defend his faith against a professor and a class full of his peers

who claimed to not believe in God. Talk about a tough task! If he was unable to convince his classmates that God existed, he would most likely fail the class. But, Josh stood firm and stepped up to the challenge! In front of 80 classmates and an angry, doubting professor, Josh acknowledged God as the creator and Lord of all of Creation.

You may never have to be in the same situation as Josh (and I hope you're not!), but every day you have the chance to confess Jesus as Lord! Acknowledging Christ doesn't always mean screaming "Christ is Lord!" from the school rooftop. Acknowledging Jesus can be as simple as following his commandments in everyday situations. 





