Don't Talk About Me Like I'm Not In The Room

This is a wonderful time of the year to think about things we might consider doing differently next year. With the knowledge that the Christian year begins with Advent, let us consider that Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany come at the beginning of the church year for a reason. It starts with a new, fresh wave of the birth of Jesus in our lives. God with us, God coming among us, God reigning down on us to do something new.

Something new! We say God does new things, but do we really believe it? Do we witness to it? Do we even try to recognize God's new initiative in our lives? Or better yet, do we recognize new initiatives in our church?

Consider this! Don't talk about me like I'm not in the room. Have you ever experienced people talking around you; people who think they know you, what you think, how you feel, and why you act the way you do? They have an entire conversation about you and never invite you into the conversation. For example, I am standing in a group of people and a conversation begins like this: Pastor Colleen said, "She thinks there is no physical place where hell is located." Well, that gets everyone's attention! Before you know it, someone says, "No, that is not what she said. She said hell is not a place where anyone goes." Then, another person says, "I heard her say that hell is not a place, but it is right here on earth." In this case, everyone is having a conversation in front of me, but not including me in the conversation. How often do we have conversations about God, but never invite God into the conversation? The theological issue of hell requires us to invite God into the conversation.

Many people think their pastor has the answers. The truth is the pastor does not have the answer to all your questions. The pastor can only tell you what he/she believes at that time in their life, because our views change over time. If you want an answer to your question, then you need to invite God to be in conversation with you. Then, you need to listen for what is revealed to you. The answer probably will not come instantly but will be revealed to you over time. Be patient.

At this time of the year, many of us have questions about what the Christmas story says to us today. What is God trying to do in your life? How is God working in our church? Invite God into your conversations, and listen!
