A Lifetime of Thriving

What do you wonder about? In your free moments, what does your mind think about? Does it go to the heat of the summer, the beauty of the Carolina sky, the political situation of our time, what you might do tomorrow, or are you able to think about nothing? Let me suggest you try to think about how you can THRIVE in life.

In May there was a clergy/spouse retreat at Black Lake near Asheboro. The Black Lake Retreat Center is owned by the Southern Conference and is available to congregations to use upon request. The setting is lovely, and there are cabins for people to stay overnight if they so choose. The Bethany congregation could use the facility for a day or a weekend. Let me know if you have any interest in having an event there.

Part of our retreat day focused on the subject of thriving. Rev. Betty Morton presented a program that asked the participants to consider how they can thrive in their lives. First, we had to define what it means to thrive. Thriving is personal. Thriving depends on who you are and what stage of life you are in. Rev. Morton presented Five Keys to Thriving; 1.) Grounding in God

- 2.) Self-knowledge (values, passions, dreams, strengths and limitations)
- 3.) Holistic self-care (care of heart, body, mind, soul and relationships)
- 4.) Mindful living 5.) Community.

An important part of life is to THRIVE not just SURVIVE. The concept of thriving not only applies to an individual, but also to the church. We want to be a church that THRIVES, not just SURVIVES. Look at the five steps above, and try to apply those to our life together as the Body of Christ.

Now, I hope you can find something to think about in your free moments. Give yourself time to consider how you can THRIVE and how our church can THRIVE. Make it your special word for the summer. 

WORSHIP SERVICE AT "THE LITTLE WHITE CHURCH"

On Sunday, August 11, at 11:00 a.m., Bethany congregation will worship at "The Little White Church" (Mt. Bethel Reformed) in Blowing Rock. Mt. Zion congregation from Lenoir will join us for a combined worship service. Lunch will be available at the Blowing Rock Conference Center following worship. Information about worship and lunch plans will be forthcoming.



Mt. Bethel United Church of Christ is the oldest church still standing in Blowing Rock. Originally a German Reformed Church, the congregation was organized in 1882 by Rev. John Ingle. Jacob Kluttz gave the property for the church and the cemetery behind the church. The church was used regularly from 1886 until 1921. Later, sister churches began visiting and holding worship services of their own during summer months. Bethany's history included summer worship at the church during the 1950's and years following. Covered dish lunches followed outdoors on the Blowing Rock Assembly Grounds.

Andrew Critcher, great-great-grandson of Jacob Kluttz, and his family now own the church. After a time of neglect, they have begun restoring the church to make it what it once was. Much damage over the years has required repairs to floorboards, support posts, stone work, windows and window sills, pews, scraping and repainting inside and out, and clearing the parking area of trees and bushes. Community involvement has helped it all happen.

The cemetery across the road from the church dates back to 1750 and was formerly known as the Elrod-Green Cemetery. It is believed to be the old Blowing Rock town cemetery. The Critcher family now owns and manages all three properties--the church and both cemeteries.

Named for his great-grandfather, Critcher has set up a nonprofit, Kluttz Preservation, for funding the restoration to get the church back to "the peaceful, grace-filled place it used to be." He says, "I just want to get the church back to its glory. It was just falling in, and I wanted to put it back exactly the way it was, maintain it and the two cemeteries, and make it a holy place and a place of peace, and just put it back the way it used to be."

Mount Bethel United Church of Christ is located at 100 Rankin Road in Blowing Rock. Make plans to worship there on August 11 as we remember Bethany's history with "The Little White Church" and make new memories in this "peaceful, grace-filled place." by Donna Ervin


