We are continuing to gather Hygiene Kits for our Lenten project. As a member congregation in Linked In New Creative (LINC) Ministry, we are participating in a community collection of hygiene kits for delivery to those in crisis. ### **Property News and Needs**

The Property Committee has received bids for some needed work around the building. The moisture and paint problems in the basement will need to be addressed in two ways. First, we need dirt added to the outside walls so that the slope moves water away from building. Then, we will need to have the affected walls of the basement scraped, sealed, and painted.

Caleb Reel, who already does our yard maintenance, submitted a bid to add the dirt to the outside beds. His bid was very reasonable and the Council approved the decision to hire Caleb to complete that portion of the work.

Kemp Sigmon submitted a bid for scraping, sealing, and painting the basement walls. Again, his bid was very reasonable and the Council approved the decision to hire Kemp to work on the interior of the basement. The outdoor work will need to be completed first and when Caleb finishes the re-sloping we will ask for an outdoor workday to mulch the beds and trim the bushes.

Finally, water from the church parking lot is running onto our neighbor's lawn. We will be placing a curb to reroute water in the near future. You'll get an update on that project as soon as the estimates are collected.
