Water, and Loving the Bible Again by Rachel Held Evans this fall. The book's eight chapters will guide us through eight Sunday morning discussions and give us a creative launch into worship, as well. The Worship Committee has also planned for this fall study, and we'll include worship components "inspired" by the same chapters during worship each of the eight Sundays.

We're purchasing the books in bulk and will have them to share on Sunday, August 28 and again on Sunday, September 4. In these days of supply chain issues, it has taken more time than usual for the windows to arrive, but we've been told that they will be installed on Wednesday, August 3. The windows are already paid for (you'll notice the extra expense included in the Treasurer's Report posted in the hallway), so there should be no further cost to the church budget. Instead, we think we'll have increased efficiency from the new windows, so maybe we'll see a decrease in our power bill. What's happening next door?! That's a good question. As we all continue to work on the parsonage, the Church Council is mindful that you are ready for an update on the progress and the prognosis. The painting is almost finished, and we are deeply grateful to everyone who has been part of the painting crew. They've saved us thousands of dollars with all their work. The downstairs bathroom is being renovated with new flooring, new faucets, new vanity and mirror. Again, many thanks are due to members who are saving us lots of money. Blinds, 22 of them, are hung in every room. In the kitchen, the appliances are sparkling clean once again. Shelf paper is on the shelves. The carpet in the study is now clean. The garage is pressure washed and will be painted soon. There is still some plumbing work that will have to be done professionally. The current hot water heater is working but because of age we probably will need a new hot water heater in the near future. It's also probable that we will need a new washer, since the one in the basement is older and very small. We still need to get the window air conditioner unit installed, clean the basement and finish some small jobs, but we are moving forward with this giant-sized project! Thank you to everyone in the congregation for your work and support.
