Generations: Millennials (or Mosaics) are the generation born between 1984 through 2002; Gen-Xers (or Busters), between 1965 and 1983; Boomers, between 1946 and 1964; and Elders, in 1945 or earlier.

Friends was the sitcom that brought Gen -Xers and Boomers together more than a decade ago. In 2014, The Big Bang Theory is the sitcom that brings Millennials and Gen-Xers and Boomers-and even a significant number of Elderstogether. Thirty percent of all adults regularly watch the show.

NCIS also enjoys cross-generational appeal, with 40% of Elders, 31% of Boomers, 17% of Gen-Xers and 17% of Millennials tuning in regularly. To a lesser extent, CSI attracts a range of ages: 29% of Elders, 23% of Boomers and 17% of Gen-Xers watch on a reqular basis. The Mentalist and Dancing With the Stars round out the top-five list for both Elders and Boomers. One in five adults in these generations watch The Mentalist, and about onequarter of Elders (24%) and 18% of Boomers regularly watch DWTS."

The first commitment is that we (all of us) ask local enterprises, businesses (those you frequent daily), and individuals for donations. The priority is a cash donation. It takes money to rent equipment and hire quality entertainers. Donations may also be "in kind" donations. For example, some businesses provide use of equipment for free. A

The second commitment every Bethany congregant must make is to work on a team that plans the details of each element of the event: sponsors/donors, publicity/advertising, registration/door prizes, food, live entertainment, games/activities, and grounds set up/tear down. The work of these teams is critical to the success of the event. Many people will work on more than one team. The work load of each team will vary. There may be a lot of work up front and taper off. Or there may be little work now but a big effort 5-20 days before the event. Note: 90% of the financial support comes from sponsors/donors and 90% of the hands-on work comes from the Bethany congregation. We must all be willing to do our part to make it

The final commitment is that you will be present on Saturday, September 13 to pitch in and help with whatever needs to be accomplished immediately before, during, and after the event. You will be asked soon what team(s) you want to work with. Please be ready to step up and do your part.
